The Second Letter of Paul to TIMOTHY

Chapter 1

Timothy Charged to Guard His Trust

- 1 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, according to the promise of life in Christ Jesus,
- 2 To Timothy, my beloved son: Grace, mercy *and* peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.
- I thank God, whom I serve with a clear conscience the way my forefathers did, as I constantly remember you in my prayers night and day,
- 4 longing to see you, even as I recall your tears, so that I may be filled with joy.
- For I am mindful of the sincere faith within you, which first dwelt in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am sure that *it is* in you as well.
- For this reason I remind you to kindle afresh the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands.
- 7 For God has not given us a spirit of timidity, but of power and love and discipline.
- Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony of our Lord or of me His prisoner, but join with *me* in suffering for the gospel according to the power of God,
- 9 who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to His own purpose and grace which was granted us in Christ Jesus from all eternity,
- but now has been revealed by the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel,
- for which I was appointed a preacher and an apostle and a teacher.
- For this reason I also suffer these things, but I am not ashamed; for I know whom I have believed and I am convinced that He is able to guard what I have entrusted to Him until that day.
- Retain the standard of sound words which you have heard from me, in the faith and love which are in Christ Jesus.

- Guard, through the Holy Spirit who dwells in us, the treasure which has been entrusted to *you*.
- You are aware of the fact that all who are in Asia turned away from me, among whom are Phygelus and Hermogenes.
- The Lord grant mercy to the house of Onesiphorus, for he often refreshed me and was not ashamed of my chains;
- but when he was in Rome, he eagerly searched for me and found me—
- the Lord grant to him to find mercy from the Lord on that day—and you know very well what services he rendered at Ephesus.

Chapter 2

Be Strong

- 1 You therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus.
- The things which you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, entrust these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also.
- 3 Suffer hardship with *me*, as a good soldier of Christ Jesus.
- 4 No soldier in active service entangles himself in the affairs of everyday life, so that he may please the one who enlisted him as a soldier.
- Also if anyone competes as an athlete, he does not win the prize unless he competes according to the rules.
- 6 The hard-working farmer ought to be the first to receive his share of the crops.
- 7 Consider what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in everything.
- **8** Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, descendant of David, according to my gospel,
- 9 for which I suffer hardship even to imprisonment as a criminal; but the word of God is not imprisoned.
- For this reason I endure all things for the sake of those who are chosen, so that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus *and* with *it* eternal glory.
- 11 It is a trustworthy statement:
 - For if we died with Him, we will also live with Him;
- 12 If we endure, we will also reign with Him;
 - If we deny Him, He also will deny us;
- 13 If we are faithless, He remains faithful, for He cannot deny Himself.

An Unashamed Workman

- Remind *them* of these things, and solemnly charge *them* in the presence of God not to wrangle about words, which is useless and leads to the ruin of the hearers.
- Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, accurately handling the word of truth.
- But avoid worldly *and* empty chatter, for it will lead to further ungodliness,
- and their talk will spread like gangrene. Among them are Hymenaeus and Philetus,
- 18 *men* who have gone astray from the truth saying that the resurrection has already taken

- place, and they upset the faith of some.
- Nevertheless, the firm foundation of God stands, having this seal, "The Lord knows those who are His," and, "Everyone who names the name of the Lord is to abstain from wickedness."
- Now in a large house there are not only gold and silver vessels, but also vessels of wood and of earthenware, and some to honor and some to dishonor.
- Therefore, if anyone cleanses himself from these *things*, he will be a <u>vessel</u> for honor, sanctified, useful to the Master, prepared for every good work.
- Now flee from youthful lusts and pursue righteousness, faith, love *and* peace, with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart.
- But refuse foolish and ignorant speculations, knowing that they produce quarrels.
- 24 The Lord's bond-servant must not be quarrelsome, but be kind to all, able to teach, patient when wronged,
- with gentleness correcting those who are in opposition, if perhaps God may grant them repentance leading to the knowledge of the truth,
- and they may come to their senses *and escape* from the snare of the devil, having been held captive by him to do his will.

Chapter 3

"Difficult Times Will Come"

- 1 But realize this, that in the last days difficult times will come.
- 2 For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, revilers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy,
- 3 unloving, irreconcilable, malicious gossips, without self-control, brutal, haters of good,
- 4 treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God,
- 5 holding to a form of godliness, although they have denied its power; Avoid such men as these.
- For among them are those who enter into households and captivate weak women weighed down with sins, led on by various impulses,
- 7 always learning and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth.
- Just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses, so these *men* also oppose the truth, men of deprayed mind, rejected in regard to the faith.
- 9 But they will not make further progress; for their folly will be obvious to all, just as Jannes's and Jambres's folly was also.
- 10 Now you followed my teaching, conduct, purpose, faith, patience, love, perseverance,
- persecutions, *and* sufferings, such as happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium *and* at Lystra; what persecutions I endured, and out of them all the Lord rescued me!
- 12 Indeed, all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.
- But evil men and impostors will proceed *from bad* to worse, deceiving and being deceived.
- You, however, continue in the things you have learned and become convinced of, knowing from whom you have learned *them*,

- and that from childhood you have known the sacred writings which are able to give you the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.
- All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness;
- so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.

Chapter 4

"Preach the Word"

- I solemnly charge *you* in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by His appearing and His kingdom:
- 2 preach the word; be ready in season *and* out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort, with great patience and instruction.
- For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but *wanting* to have their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers in accordance to their own desires
- 4 and will turn away their ears from the truth and will turn aside to myths.
- 5 But you, be sober in all things, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.
- 6 For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come.
- 7 I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith;
- 8 in the future there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day; and not only to me, but also to all who have loved His appearing.

Personal Concerns

- **9** Make every effort to come to me soon;
- for Demas, having loved this present world, has deserted me and gone to Thessalonica; Crescens *has gone* to Galatia, Titus to Dalmatia.
- Only Luke is with me. Pick up Mark and bring him with you, for he is useful to me for service.
- 12 But Tychicus I have sent to Ephesus.
- When you come bring the cloak which I left at Troas with Carpus, and the books, especially the parchments.
- Alexander the coppersmith did me much harm; the Lord will repay him according to his deeds.
- Be on guard against him yourself, for he vigorously opposed our teaching.
- At my first defense no one supported me, but all deserted me; may it not be counted against them.
- But the Lord stood with me and strengthened me, so that through me the proclamation might be fully accomplished, and that all the Gentiles might hear; and I was rescued out of the lion's mouth.

- The Lord will rescue me from every evil deed, and will bring me safely to His heavenly kingdom; to Him *be* the glory forever and ever. Amen.
- 19 Greet Prisca and Aquila, and the household of Onesiphorus.
- 20 Erastus remained at Corinth, but Trophimus I left sick at Miletus.
- 21 Make every effort to come before winter. Eubulus greets you, also Pudens and Linus and Claudia and all the brethren.
- The Lord be with your spirit. Grace be with you.
